## Heart health benefits ...

### Got chocolate? It CAN be good for you!

It's true... chocolate CAN BE good for your heart – DARK chocolate that is. Dark chocolate has the same type of flavonoids that antioxidant-rich foods such as green tea, red fruits and vegetables, and red wine too. High blood levels of flavonoids contribute to good cardiovascular health and may lower the risk of heart disease and certain cancers. That's good news for those with a sweet tooth ... a small bar every day can help keep your heart and cardiovascular system running well!

The main heart health benefits of dark chocolate are that it lowers blood pressure in individuals with high blood pressure, and it has also been shown to reduce LDL cholesterol (the bad cholesterol) by up to 10 percent.

But remember, moderation is still the key if you're planning on making dark chocolate a part of your daily routine. **Balance the calories:** chocolate is still a high-calorie, high-fat food. Most of the studies done used no more than 100 grams, or about 3.5 ounces, of dark chocolate a day to get the benefits. Here are some other tips:

- **Taste the chocolate:** Chocolate is a complex food with over 300 compounds and chemicals in each bite. To really enjoy and appreciate chocolate, take the time to taste it.
- **Skip the nougat:** You should look for pure dark chocolate or dark chocolate with nuts, orange peel or other

flavorings. Fillings are just adding sugar and fat, which erase many of the benefits you get from eating the chocolate.

- **Avoid milk:** It may taste good, but some research shows that washing your chocolate down with a glass of milk could prevent the antioxidants from being absorbed or used by your body.

boomers, and whether you're an old pro or are just starting out, here are some tips to help you:

- Do set up privacy settings for your online profile, so the intimacies of your life don't become public when people find you in a search. Facebook lets you decide who can see your information and photos. You can limit exposure to "friends" or even just a few people on your list.
- Don't rush to friend your teen or college-age kids; wait to see if they reach out to you. There may be some things you really don't want to know about your little angels.
- Don't post boring status updates on Facebook to comment about every single second of your day. Your friends don't want a rundown of how you overslept this morning, are having tummy issues and can't find that missing sock.
- Don't "friend" strangers and spend hours inspecting or commenting on their profiles. Social-networking sites are for staying in touch—not stalking.

## Leave a legacy through planned giving

People make charitable gifts to many different deserving organizations. But when a person has a personal relationship with the organization or has other reasons for providing support to that organization, they consider one of several planned giving vehicles. This enables the donor to leave a lasting legacy.

To create a legacy, a person or couple may choose from a variety of planned giving options best suited to meet the donor's and the organization's needs. Listed below are five of the more common planned giving options.

**Annuities:** These donations enable the donor to make a meaningful contribution to the organization, while the donor receives a guaranteed income for life. Consider a charitable gift annuity (CGA). A CGA is a gift of choice when a guaranteed income is desired for the donor.

**Appreciated Assets:** Donations of appreciated assets (stocks, bonds, real estate) is a powerful way to make a sizable gift. The donor

avoids capital gain taxes on the appreciation and the donor receives a tax deduction in the year of the gift.

**Bequest:** This is a gift of money or property that you may leave in your will, just as you would a loved one. It could be a specific amount, a portion of your estate, or an asset (e.g. real estate). A charitable bequest in your will is one of the simplest ways to provide continuing support for an organization.

**Life Estate Gifts:** Charitable Remainder Trusts and Charitable Lead Trusts enable donors to use their homes to maintain their home and lifestyle while providing future provisions for the charitable organization.

**Life Insurance:** Designate the organization as the beneficiary and owner of your policy. Consider this... in lieu of making an annual gift, make insurance premium payments on a life insurance policy. With this giving option, premiums are deductible as a charitable donation.

In any situation where you are considering a major gift, you should consult a financial professional who can provide advice regarding tax benefits and possible income opportunities.



## Easy Chocolate Mousse

*This "good-for-you" recipe is from the HEM Wellness Center's Chocolate Lover's class:*

12 oz. pkg. firm light Tofu (unrefrigerated)

¾ c dark chocolate chips

1 tsp vanilla

**Preparation:** Place chocolate chips in microwavable bowl, heat 1 minute on medium-high power, stir, continue to heat 30 seconds at a time until nearly all are melted. Place tofu, chocolate and vanilla in blender. Whirl until well-mixed. Refrigerate 1 hour or more before serving. Top with your favorite berries, shaved chocolate, nuts or Cool Whip.

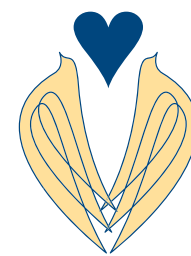
